Editorial

As the curtain falls on this whirlwind of a year, I've found myself pondering the ideal theme for a final editorial. No singular topic comes to mind; instead, a mosaic of musings fills my thoughts. The year commenced with a series of articles delving into the metamorphosis of the car hobby, exploring pop-up meets, and the vibrant cars & coffee events. It seems fitting to conclude the year by circling back to these themes.

Gary Highee highlighted an excellent Hagerty magazine article that was published in the November edition titled "MGs, Minis, and Millennials: The Next Generation of Little British Car Enthusiasts." It is a great read, I and encourage everyone that thinks the hobby is dying to read it. I think it is spot-on. The hobby is not dying, but it will and is changing as Millennials and Gen Z buy or inherit these iconic sportscars of the 50s, 60s, and 70s. They will be a driving crowd that has no time and no interest in formal clubs or formal car shows. How many entries did we have in the cars show this year of people 30 or younger? Not many. These groups have all grown up connected by the multitudes of social media platforms, and they already are better connected than the Boomers or GenX.

What's striking is the frequency of Millennial and Gen Z gatherings. Millennials and Gen Z are meeting far more frequent than any club or formal group meets. They meet every few days! There is a "pop-up meet" every other day on Facebook and various other platforms. They basically send out an invite open to anyone and everyone for "tomorrow night" somewhere in Chattanooga. And they are all over Chattanooga and hosting multiple events at any given time. These are not well attended meets - but they are not grading the event based on attendance like so many of the oldschool car-show guys do. They are between 10 and 20 people/cars. These are very modified cars, and they are between 20 and 30 years old - and newer. I still cannot understand why there is a large group of Chargers, Challengers and Mustangs that could have just arrived from the dealerships last week.

Looking ahead, Riverside 9 is fast approaching and is scheduled for April 5th and 6th, 2024. This is a Millennial event, designed for the Millennials, by a Millennial. I wrote an editorial on Riverside 8 many months ago in greater detail.

Riverside 9 will be in Chattanooga, and it will likely host 500 cars owned mainly by Millennials and Gen Z'ers. It will be a host of heavily modified 5, 10-, 20-, 30- and

40-year-old cars. These 2 sociological groups are now between the ages of 11 and 42. You will not find any concours cars there, so if that is your cup of tea, this scene will not be of interest. I will say, as I said before, the event looks very, very well done. It should be. It is a for profit event. Unlike the old-school car shows that are raising money for a cause, this is a money-making venture. There is nothing wrong with that – but it is in sharp contrast to most car shows hosted by local groups today. I say event – because it is an event – and it is not a show. No awards. No classes. If you are into these slammed cars, ricers cars, late model modifieds, and etc, you should attend. I seriously doubt there is a SBCC member with a car that would even be allowed to register in the event. Why? Too original. Too restored. If you are not into these types of cars, well, don't go. I won't. I am just interested enough to write about it, but I'm not interested enough to attend. Actually, I would love for someone in the club to go and submit an article about it. I just don't really have time. I don't really have time for much of anything in the way of hobbies.

On a personal note, I find myself grappling with the challenges of maintaining my trio of "running" hobby cars, two of which are sidelined currently. It is frustrating to have 2 of your 3 cars out of action. It is undeniably a "first-world problem," that highlights the need to reassess my priorities. I don't have a lot of time, and I don't have an endless supply of money.

So, what does that mean for 2024? First, I am scaling back my participation in car functions, events, and shows, opting to spend more weekends in my garage, tending to necessary maintenance. Second, I may get myself down to only two cars and a daily driver. I know, I know. A very first world problem, again. 2 cars are all anyone really needs. You need a sportscar, and you need a GT car. Something must go. Maybe two somethings – as I do technically have four hobby cars.

Thus, my New Year's resolution for 2024 takes shape.
